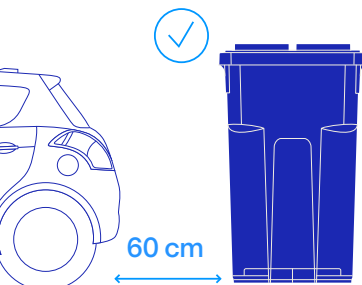
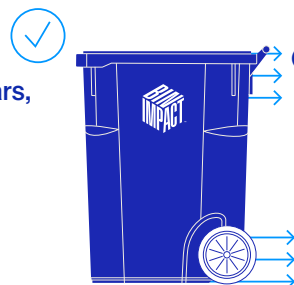
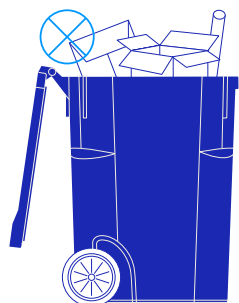
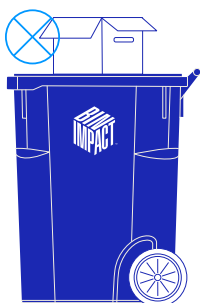
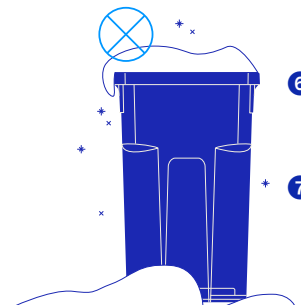




How to use your bin properly

-
